The Certified Manager of Community Associations (CMCA®) designation is earned through the Community Association Managers International Certification Board (CAMICB). This board administers the CMCA examination which is a rigorous test that measures knowledge of community management best practices. There are more than 20,000 CMCAs worldwide who have demonstrated the skills essential for managing homeowner and condominium associations and housing cooperatives.



More than 70 million Americans live in an estimated 345,000 association-governed communities, and many of those communities entrust their management to CMCAs. These skilled professionals are trained in the evolving complexities of community association management. CMCA-certified managers have the expertise needed to safeguard the assets of community associations, protecting home values and providing homeowners with peace of mind.

The CMCA is accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA) and complies with the NCCA's stringent national standards for a professional certification program.

CAMICB is an independent board that sets the standards for community association managers worldwide. It is the first and only organization created solely to certify community association managers and enhance the professional practice of community association management.

CMCA Standards of Professional Conduct

The Community Association Managers International Certification Board requires a CMCA to comply with the Standards of Professional Conduct, which govern their professional activities. This helps ensure that your CMCA-certified manager will act in an ethical manner in all situations and always be on the lookout for the best interest of you and your community association.
